Mission Notes

- Catholic Charities has five new office locations to serve Harvey survivors:
 - Our Mother of Mercy, Beaumont
 - St. Mary Hospital,
 Port Arthur
 - Our Lady of Lourdes, Vidor
 - Our Lady of the Pines. Woodville
 - Office of Emergency Management, Livingston
- Disaster Case Manager (DCM) allocation by county is:
 - 13 for Jefferson
 - 9 for Orange
 - 1 for Polk
 - 1 for Tyler
- Each DCM will serve an estimated 35 families
- The initial contract term for Project Comeback: TEXAS expires August 2019; a contract extension is anticipated but not yet confirmed.



Harvey Disaster Recovery

The vast majority of our 2017-2018 fiscal year was focused on disaster relief and recovery work in response to Hurricane Harvey that devastated the Texas Gulf Coast in August 2017. In late May 2018 we entered into an agreement with Catholic Charities USA to serve as a provider with the federally funded disaster case management program Project Comeback: TEXAS. This program is an initiative of National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster or NVOAD and is a consortium with five of its member agencies: Catholic Charities USA. Islamic Circle of North America (ICNA), Lutheran Disaster Response, the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, and the United Methodist Committee on (UMCOR).

Project Comeback: TEXAS will serve an estimated 12,000 cases across the 33 counties that received individual assistance disaster declarations. As part of this consortium, our agency is allocated to hire 24 Disaster Case Managers (DCMs) who will serve an estimated 840 cases across four counties that include Jefferson, Orange, Polk, and Tyler.

Because the federal funding for this program does not include financial assistance for survivors, it is the role of the DCMs to help survivors develop recovery plans and then to find the resources needed to complete those plans.

There are another 12 staff who support the work of this program to cover needed ancillary services such as program oversight, construction cost estimating, resource coordination, human resources, accounting, and clerical/ data management. Funding for these positions is supported by Project Comeback: TEXAS and by Catholic Charities USA.

To qualify for this program with our agency, survivors must reside in one of the four counties being served through Project Comeback: TEXAS. All Harvey survivors are eligible to receive services under this program including individuals and families without US citizenship.





Our Programs

Asset Building Case Management (ABC) combines financial education with long-term case helping management, families develop spending plans, repair their credit, increase their savings, and make progress toward home ownership or continued education. Free income tax preparation and matched savings accounts are also services available to eligible clients. Counseling provides **Services** professional individual, family, and group counseling services on a sliding fee scale making it affordable for those in need of mental health support.

Disaster Response provides financial assistance and longterm case management to help families rebuild their lives after major disasters. Emergency assistance is also provided for families facing a temporary financial crisis. Elijah's Place gives peer and adult support to children ages 5 to 18 who are grieving the death of a parent or sibling. The Hospitality Center provides a clean, safe, and dignified environment where those with limited resources have access to a hearty, midday meal every day of the year. Our Immigration Services Program is the only

nonprofit in our region that is recognized bv Department of Justice as a qualified provider immigration legal services such as family visa petitions, naturalization applications, and self-petitions for battered immigrants. Local church leaders working to organize social justice advocacy teams and social ministry services are provided technical support through assistance Parish Social Ministry Program.
